Who Needs to File:

- Residents between the ages of 18-65 (including part-year residents).
- Residents 65 years or older with taxable income.
- Businesses doing business in Fairfield.
- Employees working in Fairfield whose employer failed to fully withhold Fairfield taxes.
- Non-residents with income or losses from self-employment and/or rental property earned within the City limits.

When to File:

- Individuals and Business Net-Profit (excluding fiscal year filers) due **April 15, 2025**.
- Employer reconciliations due **February 28, 2025**.
- Please visit our website for details on extensions for time to file your return.

What is Needed to File:

Concept for Whispering Hill

NEW HOUSING PLANNED FOR GILMORE ROAD

Fairfield's newest housing subdivision, Whispering Hill, is set to break ground in summer of 2025. Located on South Gilmore Road north of Mack Road, the development will offer 68 paired single-family for-sale villas. The project, recently approved by Fairfield Planning Commission and City Council, will be developed by M/I Homes.

Located on a 17.9-acre site near Mercy Health-Fairfield Hospital, the development will feature homes ranging from 1,500 to 3,200 square feet, with options for two, three, or four bedrooms and either a second floor or basement. While exact prices will be determined as construction is completed, the units are expected to range from the mid \$300,000s to the upper \$400,000s.

The villas will provide a modern, low-maintenance living option with each homeowner owning the land beneath their unit. A homeowner's association will maintain common areas. The Whispering Hill subdivision will include amenities such as walking trails, a sidewalk connecting to South Gilmore Road, and a landscaped retention pond.



Chamber Opens New Office

The Fairfield Chamber of Commerce has officially relocated to a new office space at 700 Nilles Road in Fairfield's Town Center. This move offers increased visibility and improved facilities for members. The new location boasts a modern training area accommodating up to 50 people, a comfortable member's lounge, a kitchenette, and an accessible bathroom.



The Chamber's 300+ members can now utilize the office for various purposes, including:

- Hosting small meetings
- Working between appointments with complimentary Wi-Fi
- Conducting training sessions and employee events



New Businesses on Pleasant Avenue

The shopping plaza in the 5000-5100 block of Pleasant Avenue, once known as Riegert Square, has seen a surge of new activity in recent months. This includes:

- **Haute Hair Studio** (5098 Pleasant Avenue) relocated into the center from Nilles Road, offering an upscale salon for hair and skin services.
- **Game 4 Less** (5096 Pleasant Avenue) opened a new shop where customers can buy, sell, and trade video games.
- **Dean Snyder Attorney at Law** (5110 Pleasant Avenue) relocated from across the street into a renovated law office.
- **Mother Earth** (5158 Pleasant Avenue) is completing repairs following an automobile crashing into the storefront to once again welcome customers.

New Route 4 Restaurants

Fairfield has two new restaurants on the Route 4 corridor, Kyushu Sushi & Ramen and Wado African Restaurant.



Kyushu is located at 6775 Dixie Hwy Suite A (near Starbucks) and serves ramen, sushi, and other Japanese dishes.

Wado African Restaurant & Bar is located at 6600 Dixie Hwy. in the Diplomat Village Plaza. Wado serves African cuisine carefully and traditionally prepared.



Brush Collection Begins in April

Curbside brush collection begins the first full week in April and runs through October. Please call Public Works to be added to the list for curbside pickup. Pickups will be scheduled (starting the first Monday of each month) as follows:

1st full week of each month -
areas west of Pleasant
Avenue (U.S. 27)

2

2nd week of each month -
areas between Pleasant
Avenue and Winton Road

The Operation Drop Box Program allows residents to dispose of larger amounts of brush. The Public Works Department will place a box in the resident's driveway for a set period, during which they can fill it with yard waste for City disposal. This service is for limbs and brush only.

City of Fairfield Residential Tree Program

Let's work together to maintain Fairfield as a great
"Tree City" with a thriving urban forest.

The Residential Tree Program provides the City's homeowners with a 50% co-pay, up to \$200, for a tree purchased from Meyer's Garden Center & Landscaping or Lakeview Garden Center & Landscaping.

GUIDELINES

- Tree must be purchased from Meyer's Garden Center & Landscaping (5072 Dixie Hwy) or Lakeview Garden Center & Landscaping (6061 Pleasant Ave).
- The tree must be planted on the resident's property or (if approved by the City) in the public right-of-way.
- An approved application is required prior to purchase to ensure that funds are available.
- Each property owner may request one tree per year.
- Program runs from April 1 through November 1, 2025.

FAIRFIELD FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

The Department is Growing!



The Fairfield Fire Department is so proud to share the news of nine newly-hired employees who began their service to the City in January 2025. These new employees were highly-qualified and stood out amongst the long list of applicants, and we are so excited to have them within our ranks! Their experience ranges from new to the fire service to tenured fire veterans, but all will be greatly utilized to continue improving our service and emergency response.

We welcomed the following Firefighter/EMTs to the department on January 6th- Colson Bryan (1 year of fire service experience) and Marcus Carpenter (1.5 years of fire service experience). In addition, seven seasoned Firefighter/Paramedics joined the department- Austin Flannery (7 years of fire service experience), Jake Hendricks (7.5 years of fire service experience), Sarah Markey (4 years of fire service experience), Brooke Owens (7 years of fire service experience), Aaron Roesch (4 years of fire service experience), Zach Smith (17 years of fire service experience), and Christopher Spinosi (2.5 years of fire service experience).

These new employees are especially critical for the continued strength of the Fairfield Fire Department, as our members responded to 7,973 calls for emergency assistance during 2024, which was a 3.7% increase in response volume compared to the previous year. The increased demand for fire and emergency medical response cements the need for additional members to help alleviate stress on our personnel.



“Artfully” Training a Safer Fairfield

Poster Contest - Fairfield City School District

Young people are key pieces to the safety puzzle! With so many children throughout our community, it is essential that we equip them with the knowledge of how to stay safe if a fire were to happen at home. To make safety discussions more fun and engaging, we have utilized an annual poster contest beginning in September (Fire Safety Awareness Month) and have invited all elementary-age students within the Fairfield City School District to participate. This year, each FFD firehouse judged the submitted posters for the elementary school within their run district, and crowning three winners- Sasrika Regmi from South Elementary, Mia Riley from West Elementary, and Quinn Collins from Central Elementary.



Each winner was picked up from school in a FFD firetruck and driven back to the firehouse nearest their school building for a pancake breakfast prepared by the firefighters, as well as a tour of the firehouse and equipment! We continue to be grateful to Fairfield City Schools for such an important partnership that brings safety training directly into the classroom.



2024 - By the Numbers

Last year was a busy and productive year for the Fairfield Fire Department! Not only were requests for emergency response up by 285 calls in comparison to 2023, but FFD members were actively involved in community engagements, educational events, and operational training. Promoting safety discussions and building community resilience are vital parts of our mission. We are encouraged by the positive impact our interactions with Fairfield's diverse community groups are having on the community as a whole.

Change Your Clocks, Change Your Batteries!

Did you know that nearly three out of five home fire deaths occur in homes where there is no working smoke alarms? Take an easy step in protecting your family and home and test your smoke alarm on a regular basis by pushing the 'test' button on the alarm. Don't forget to change the batteries in your smoke alarm. Daylight Saving Time offers a great way to remember when to change your batteries, with the saying "Change your clocks, change your batteries!" Daylight Saving Time starts on Sunday, March 9th, so be sure to change the batteries in your home's smoke alarms.

Would you be able to assist someone experiencing a medical emergency before FFD paramedics arrive on the scene? If you are part of a group or organization that would benefit from safety training, including fire safety, CPR instruction, proper usage of AEDs, and more, the Fairfield Fire Department would be glad to accommodate your needs. Throughout 2024, members of the Fairfield Fire Department spent considerable time at various community events, in Fairfield school buildings, and club/organizational gatherings, speaking about fire safety and sharing essential safety instruction that can make a huge difference before emergency responders can arrive on the scene of a fire or medical event. The Fairfield Fire Department strongly believes that a well-prepared and informed community is a safer community, and we are committed to continuing our outreach throughout the year. 2024 Route 4 Sidewalk - *Camelot Drive to Nilles Road*

Project Description

This project was designed to improve the pedestrian connectivity along Route 4 in this high pedestrian area. There was enough foot traffic in this area to where a path had been worn in the existing grass and both kids and adults were regularly observed walking along the paved shoulder of Route 4 prior to construction.

This sidewalk connection was identified in the City's Active Transportation Plan and funded through local funds from the City of Fairfield's Street Improvement Fund and a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) for \$130,300. This project was administered by the Public Works Department.


ACTIVE SHOOTER RESPONSE TRAINING

- 1. Quick, Informed Decision-Making:** In a high-stress situation, clear thinking can be challenging. Active shooter training provides guidance on how to assess threats and make quick, informed decisions that can save lives, such as when to evacuate, hide, or confront an attacker.
- 2. Enhanced Safety and Security:** Training raises awareness about security protocols and potential vulnerabilities in a facility. It teaches participants how to secure areas, work with emergency personnel, and take practical steps to increase personal and group safety during an incident.
- 3. Reduced Panic and Increased Control:** Knowing what to do reduces fear and panic, helping individuals maintain control over themselves and their environment. This is critical in high-stress scenarios where panic can escalate the situation and lead to dangerous outcomes.
- 4. Team Coordination and Communication:** Training programs often involve simulated scenarios that help participants practice communication, teamwork, and role-based responsibilities, ensuring they work together efficiently during an actual emergency.
- 5. Preparation for Any Environment:** Whether in a school, workplace, or public space, active shooter training can be adapted to different settings, giving people a versatile skill set to respond effectively regardless of where they are.
- 6. Increased Survival Rates:** Studies show that preparedness and quick response are major factors in reducing casualties in active shooter events. Training can significantly increase the likelihood of survival by educating participants on best practices.

By providing the knowledge, skills, and confidence to act swiftly and decisively, active shooter training can protect lives and enhance overall safety in our communities. Help save lives by empowering your employees to participate in their own survival using proactive, options-based strategies in the face of violence.
