UCR Part I Crime Statistics

Snapshot Report

Table 1 shows the number of UCR Part I offenses reported to the Fairfield Police Department beginning in the year 2017. The data from 2017-2025 suggest a downward trend overall in reported crime and only a slight increase between 2023-2024. There was an increase in rape, robbery, and aggravated assault between 2024 and 2025 which may be attributed to a change in reporting system and classifications of crime to follow NIBRS reporting. There was a decrease in auto thefts and burglary.

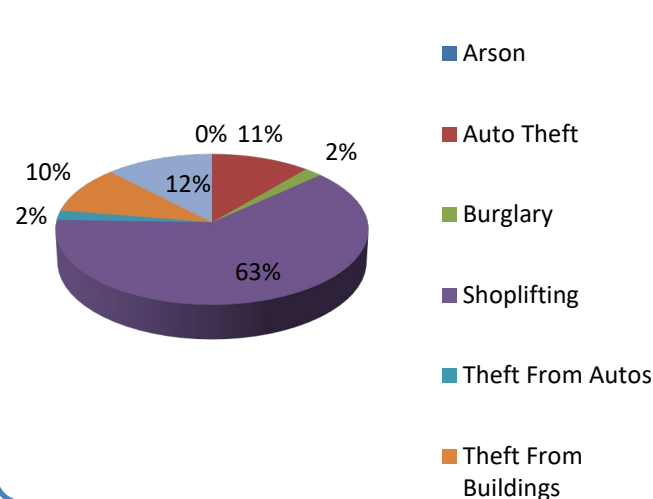

Violent & Property Crimes

UCR classifies homicide, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault as violent crimes. Burglary, theft, auto theft, and arson are classified as property crimes. In 2025, 89.2% of the reported Part I crimes to the Fairfield Police have been

property crimes. The chart provides statistical information on property crimes. For 2025, burglaries accounted for 5.21% of all reported property crimes. The vast majority of burglaries occur in residential areas. These burglaries often occur during daylight hours when homeowners are at work or on vacation, and entry is often gained through unlocked doors and windows. Visit our [Home Security](#) webpage for more information on burglary prevention. The chart also provides statistical information on the various types of theft committed in the City of Fairfield. For 2025, thefts *from* autos account for 9.35% and thefts from buildings account for 11.05% of all reported property crimes. Theft from auto are often the most reported Part I crime to the Fairfield Police Department but one of the easiest to prevent.
